Pleasantville City Council Meeting September 16, 2025 at 5:30pm

Mayor Kody Jurgens opened the meeting with council members Aaron Hurt, Rachel Lopez, Jon Koehn, Kyle Patterson, and Jordan Van Ness present. Jon Koehn was present via zoom.

Council Member Hurt asked that more clarification be included in the letters to property owners regarding weeds. City Clerk/Admin, Rachel Reed, explained that she has tried to contact each of the property owners that received letters to give them an explanation, but will include more detail in the letters. Hurt also asked about the property located at the corner of Jasper and Columbus. Attorney, Bob Stuyvesant, informed the council that his processor has been to a couple addresses to serve him and they haven't been able to locate the property owner. Reed reminded Stuyvesant that she had sent him a new address in Ankeny. Stuyvesant explained that it is pending in court. Hurt asked how long we allow this to keep going on, he doesn't want it to be an indefinite process as it has been 6 months since the initial complaint. Stuyvesant explained it can be an issue when the property owner can't be located.

Public Works Director, Shawn Breazeale, informed the council that the Shadle Park Pond is low because of the constant leak with the Agri-drain system. He explained they are dropping the level of the pond so they can put quikrete in the Agri-drain to try to get it to seal. If that does not solve the problem, then most likely the system will have to be replaced. He explained that we have about \$10,700 of contingency funds that haven't been released. Hurt asked about a follow-up meeting regarding the water treatment plant. Reed informed the council that we are waiting to hear back from Marion County Rural Water on whether they intend to continue to purchase water from the city because this will help determine the cost of the treatment plant.

Parks & Rec Director, Jordan Flaws, informed the council that wrestling registrations opens this Friday and close on Oct. 3rd and basketball registration will end Monday. Also, the comedian is scheduled for Saturday Oct. 4th at the Memorial Hall.

Police Chief, Adam Choat, informed the council that Josh is on his 3rd week at the academy. Library Director, JoEllen Glick, thanked Chief Choat for the story time session that he had with the children.

Attorney, Bob Stuyvesant, informed the council that the litigation with the prior police officer is resolved without the 2 additional things they requested.

Louis Plude informed the council that the Christmas on the Square Committee has been planning and adding activities to this years celebration. He will have more details on the activities and events at the October council meeting.

Motion by Van Ness, seconded by Patterson to approve the consent agenda as follows; approval of previous council meeting minutes, approval of August 2025 financial reports, approval of water consumption report for August 2025, approval of employee comp time, approval of Police Report, approval of the Annual Urban Renewal Report, approval of the Annual Street Finance Report, and approval of the following bills: All voting in favor, motion carried.

New Business:

Motion by Hurt, seconded by Lopez to approve street closure on Jackson Street from Jefferson to Washington on Oct. 2nd from 3-7pm for Peoples Bank Homecoming Tailgate event. All voting in favor, motion carried

Reed talked to the council adopting an LMI Set-Aside funds Policy. She provided samples of policies to the council and talked about projects that can be included in the policy. Council members Lopez and Van Ness volunteered to serve on a subcommittee to help develop a policy for the council to consider.

Reed informed the council that she reached out to Iowa Codification for sample ordinances for temporary outdoor liquor licenses. Chief Choat talked about requirements of other agencies with which he has worked. The council agreed to have Reed present an ordinance to the council that would require a certified peace officer for an event with an attendance of 150 or more and a perimeter of at least 4ft in height surrounding the service area.

Reed informed the council that Michelle Greene reached out to see if the city would consider lowering the price for the commercial lot at 1012 W Pleasant St. as it has been on the market for over 4 months and she has not had any serious prospects. The council discussed the potential development surrounding the lot and the cost the city has in the lot. The council agreed to keep it listed as it is.

Old Business:

Motion by Hurt, seconded by Lopez to enter into closed session pursuant to IA Code Chapter 21.5.1(c), to discuss strategy with counsel in matters that are presently in litigation. Hurt aye, Lopez aye, Koehn aye, Patterson aye, and Van Ness aye. Motion carried.

No action was taken from the closed session.

Motion by Patterson, seconded by Van Ness to adjourn. All voting in favor motion carried.
