Mayor Marsh opened the public hearing to amending zoning code chapter 165.15 by adding a provision that prohibits parking on the grass. Mrstik informed the council that 2 people have reached out and donated \$500 each to give gift cards around the community during the holidays.

Public Works Director, Shawn Breazeale, gave thanks to the mayor for helping with snow removal. He also informed the council that the old International sold for the second time.

New Business:

Jurgens nay, Allen aye, Wallace aye, Patterson nay, Van Ness aye. Motion carries.

Motion by Allen, seconded by Wallace to waive the second and third readings of Ordinance No. 2007, amending Chapter 165.15 by adding a provision prohibiting parking on grass. Allen aye, Patterson nay, Van Ness aye, Wallace aye, Jurgens nay. Motion failed to carry.

Engineer, Jim Lund, explained the plans, specifications, form of contract and estimated cost for the construction of WWTP improvements to the mayor and council. Breazeale explained some of his concerns, he explained we just received the plans from Jim and he hasn't had much time to review them. Motion by Van Ness, seconded by Allen to table the proposed plans, specifications, form of contract and estimated cost for the construction of WWTP improvements. All voting in favor motion carries.

The council discussed the supplemental agreement with Snyder & Associates for the WWTP digester bidding and construction services. Motion by Van Ness, seconded by Patterson to approve the supplemental agreement with Snyder & Associates for the WWTP digester bidding and construction services in the amount of \$38,310. Allen nay, Patterson aye, Jurgens aye, Van Ness aye, Wallace aye. Motion carries.

Motion by Allen, seconded by Van Ness to approve the city's annual examination. All voting in favor motion carried.

Motion by Van Ness, seconded by Patterson to approve Jasper Street pay application no. 13 to Iowa Civil Contracting in the amount of \$187,170.67. All voting in favor motion carries.

Motion by Allen, seconded by Van Ness to approve the Jasper Street change order no. 2 to Iowa Civil Contracting in the amount of \$2,255.34 for a water main extension north on Columbus Street. All voting in favor motion carried.

Mrstik explained to the council that we have received a quote for new flooring for the entry way and kitchenette area in the Memorial Hall. Motion by Jurgens, seconded by Van Ness to approve up to \$7500 for the new flooring in the Memorial Hall. All voting in favor motion carries.

Old Business:

Motion by Van Ness, seconded by Allen to approve Resolution No. 20-20, approving tax abatement for 300 S Business Hwy 5. All voting in favor motion carries.

Motion by Allen, seconded by Van Ness to approve the Certificate of Final Completion for the WWTP. All voting in favor motion carries.

Motion by Van Ness, seconded by Jurgens to adjourn the meeting. All voting in favor motion carried.
