Pleasantville City Council Meeting

May 18, 2021 at 5:30pm

Mayor Steve Marsh opened the meeting with council members Kody Jurgens, Clinton Wallace and Kyle Patterson present. Council Members Carol Otto and Jordan Van Ness were absent.

Mayor Marsh opened the public hearing to enter into a sewer revenue loan and disbursement agreement. Judy Moon asked the council what the loan was for. Engineer, Jordan Stoermer, informed her that this loan is for the digester project at the wastewater treatment facility. Motion by Wallace, seconded by Patterson to close the public hearing. All voting in favor motion carried.

Mayor Marsh informed the council that he received a letter of resignation from Council Member Carol Otto. Her last day to serve as a council member is May 19, 2021. Attorney, Bob Stuyvesant, explained to the council the next step they need to do is decide if they will appoint to fill the vacancy or hold a special election. City Administrator, Joe Mrstik, will post on the city's website and Facebook that the council intends to fill the vacancy by appointment and any individuals interested should submit in writing to city hall.

Wallace informed the council that he has heard several good comments about the baseball/softball facilities we have.

Parks and Rec Director, Jordan Flaws, gave thanks for the comments on the facilities and gave thanks for all the help he received. The improvements were a group effort with public works, volunteers, and himself. Flaws informed the council that the tournament went well last weekend and there is another one scheduled and that will be the last one until August.

Library Director, Joellen Glick, asked what the projected time frame is for the city to take over the library. City Clerk, Rachel Reed, explained that she talked to Ron Danks, and he agreed that it would work best for the city to take over July 1st, starting the new budget year.

Judy Moon made a complaint to the council about citizens shooting fireworks in the city last July 4th. Mrstik, informed her that they are legal to discharge fireworks between noon and 11:00pm on July 4th.

Charles Rains, explained to the council that he received a letter regarding his tractor being parked on the grass. He expressed to the council that he feels this Ordinance is too strict for a small town. Mrstik informed the council and Mr. Rains that after the ordinance was passed, he and his officers made several contacts in person and in writing to inform property owners of the new ordinance. He explained that they will continue to work with property owners and inform them of the ordinance if they have a vehicle or type of trailer parked on the grass. The ordinance states they must be parked on a parking pad that is dust proof.

Motion by Patterson, seconded by Jurgens to approve the consent agenda as follows; approval of previous council meeting minutes, approval of April 2021 financial reports, approval of water consumption report for April 2021, approval of employee comp time, approval of Police Report, approval of Class C Liquor License for Frosty's Pub 'n Grub, and approval of the following bills: All voting in favor, motion carried.

New Business:

The council reviewed the purchase agreement from Josh Jenkins for the purchase of 105 E Dewitt St. They have concerns about some of the terms he has in his agreement. Attorney Stuyvesant recommended the council table the issue and negotiate the terms with Mr. Jenkins. Motion by Wallace, seconded by Jurgens to table the Resolution authorizing disposal of 105 E Dewitt St. All voting in favor motion carried.

Mayor Marsh opened the discussion to approve Engineering RFQ for the water main project on State St. The city received RFQ's from the following Engineering Firms; Garden & Associates, ISG and Snyder & Associates. Mayor Marsh informed the council that the city has worked with Garden & Associates in the past and currently works with Snyder & Associates. Kelly Evans with ISG has recently been of assistance to the Public Works Director, Shawn Breazeale, and has been in attendance to the last 3 council meetings discussing the water main project. Motion by Patterson, seconded by Jurgens to approve the Engineering RFQ from ISG for the State St. water main project. All voting in favor motion carried.

The council discussed the parcel split request at 405 N Columbus St. If the split is approved, it would leave one lot a non-conforming lot. No action was taken.

Motion by Wallace, seconded by Patterson to approve Resolution 21-15, appointing John Koehn as a new Planning and Zoning Committee Member. All voting in favor motion carried.

Motion by Wallace, seconded by Patterson to approve Resolution 21-16, authorizing and approving a loan and disbursement agreement and providing for the issuance and securing the payment of Sewer Revenue Bond, Series 2021. All voting in favor motion carried.

Motion by Jurgens, seconded by Wallace to pass the second reading for Ordinance No. 2108, adding a new chapter entitled UTVs. All voting in favor motion carried.

Motion by Wallace, seconded by Patterson to set a public hearing for the FY 2021 budget amendment for June 15, 2021 at 5:30pm. All voting in favor motion carried.

Old Business:

Mrstik explained he will continue to work on the results of the survey for the pit bull ordinance.
