Pleasantville City Council Meeting August 16, 2022, at 5:30pm

Mayor Brandon Pennington opened the meeting with council members Kody Jurgens, Rachel Lopez, Jon Koehn, and Kyle Patterson present. Jordan Van Ness was absent.

Council Member Jurgens explained to the council that he met with Public Works Director, Shawn Breazeale, regarding a storm drain at the school. The drain cap needs replaced to match the grade. Kody explained that after discussing the issue with Breazeale that they agreed it would be a cost share between the city and the school.

Police Chief/City Administrator, Joe Mrstik, explained that he and the interview committee has completed interviews for 2 candidates for the full-time police officer position. Both candidates are scheduled to do a ride along with officer Eysink. They will also complete an interview for a detailed background check. Neither of the candidates are certified, therefore, the city will have to send one to the academy. Mrstik also explained that he and the Friends of the East Elementary met with a developer from Madison WI. He explained that at this point they have only had conversations with the developer there is no commitment. He informed the council that the condition of the building continues to deteriorate.

Public Works Director, Shawn Breazeale, informed the council that there is a waste tour program scheduled at the wastewater treatment plant. There will be DNR staff and engineers there, the goal is to make the wastewater treatment plant run more efficiently. He also informed the council that there was a meeting with North Corp Water, Marion County Rural Water and himself. North Corp is ready to turn the water system over to Marion County Rural Water. He explained that the water contract with Marion County Rural Water will need to be renegotiated. Also, if the city is considering annexing Harrison Lane, now would be a good time to start that process.

Judy Moon expressed her concern about kids riding bikes on the city's trail. She explained that she has had a couple times where she was about hit by a bike. Mrstik explained that he would put a post on the City's Facebook page about the issue.

Susan Tender informed the council that the Friends of the East Elementary will be holding an event Sept. 24, 2022, to raise money for the school and park. The event will be held at the Old East Elementary property. Motion by Jurgens, seconded by Koehn to approve to enter the school event agenda to the council packet.

Motion by Jurgens, seconded by Lopez to approve the consent agenda as follows; approval of previous council meeting minutes, approval of July 2022 financial reports, approval of water consumption report for July 2022, approval of employee comp time, approval of Police Report, and approval of the following bills: All voting in favor, motion carried.

Motion by Jurgens, seconded by Koehn to approve the Chamberlain parcel split contingent upon the plat of survey being updated with the comments from Snyder & Associates. All voting in favor motion carried.

Motion by Lopez, seconded by Jurgens to approve the following Local Option Sales Tax Grant applicants; Pleasantville Senior Center \$4300.00, Marion County Special Olympics \$600.00, Pleasantville Garden Club \$600.00, Pleasantville After Prom Task Force \$500.00, Friends of the Webb Shadle Library \$4350.00, Pleasantville Youth Initiative \$5000.00, and American Legion Post 108 \$650.00. All voting in favor motion carried.

Motion by Jurgens, seconded by Patterson to approve Resolution 22-29, authorizing, and approving a Loan and Disbursement Agreement and providing for the issuance and securing the payment of \$2,223,000 Water Revenue Bonds, Series 2022. All voting in favor motion carried.

Engineer, Jordan Stoermer, explained to the council that the pay request for CL Carroll for the WWTP Digester is a credit to the city. Motion by Jurgens, seconded by Koehn to approve pay request #10 to CL Carroll for the WWTP Digester as a credit amount to the city for \$2206.85. All voting in favor, motion carried.

Motion by Jurgens, seconded by Koehn to approve street closure on Washington Street from Monroe to Jackson for a homecoming event on Sept. 22nd from 4-6pm. All voting in favor motion carried.

Old Business:

Mrstik updated the council about the Adkins Development. He explained there is a meeting scheduled with our bond attorney and financial advisor to start working on an agreement between the city, county, and developer.

Motion by Jurgens, seconded by Lopez to adjourn. All voting in favor motion carried.
